ΠΚΑ's FIRST NATIONAL DREAMGIRL



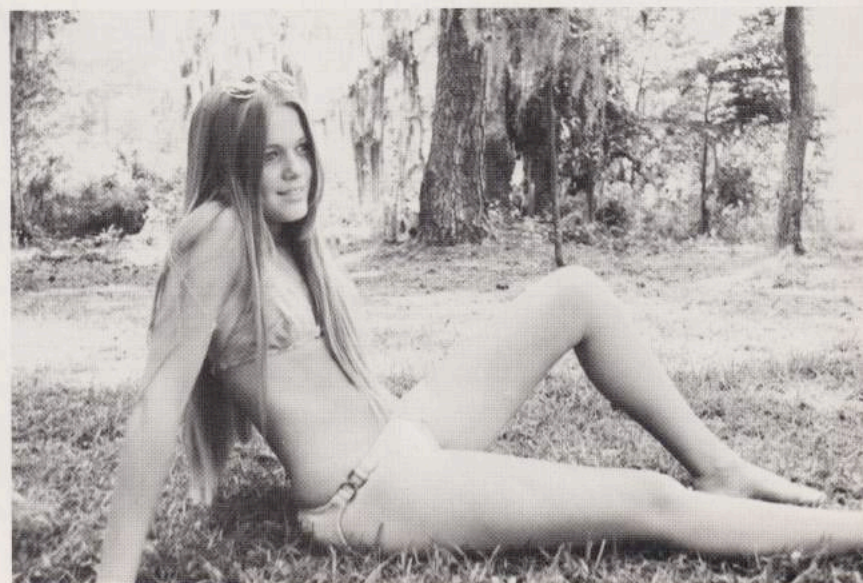

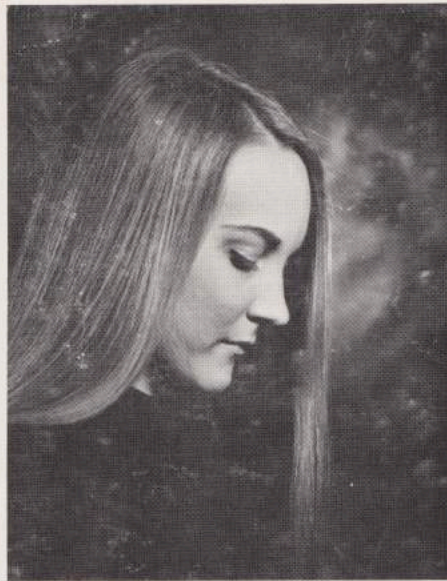


1972 NATIONAL DREAMGIRL FINALIST

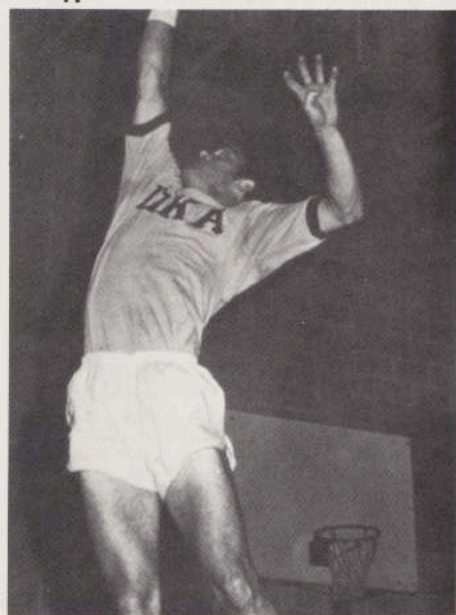
- ★ PIKE TEAMS MADE THE PLAY-OFFS IN EVERY SPORT

CHARLIE FUNK, now a coach in Coral Gables, set the All-School record for the most points scored by an individual in an intramural basketball game.

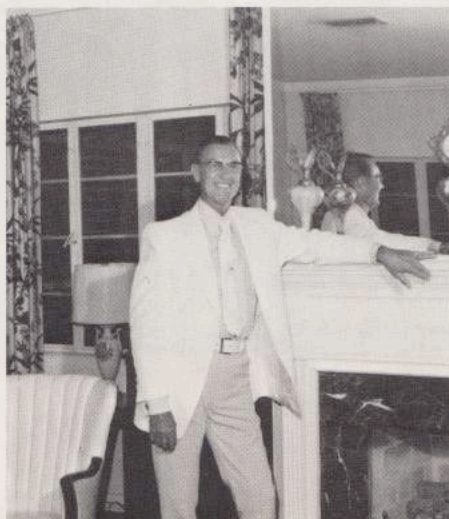
Charlie officially scored an incredible 84 points during one game of the 1966 season.

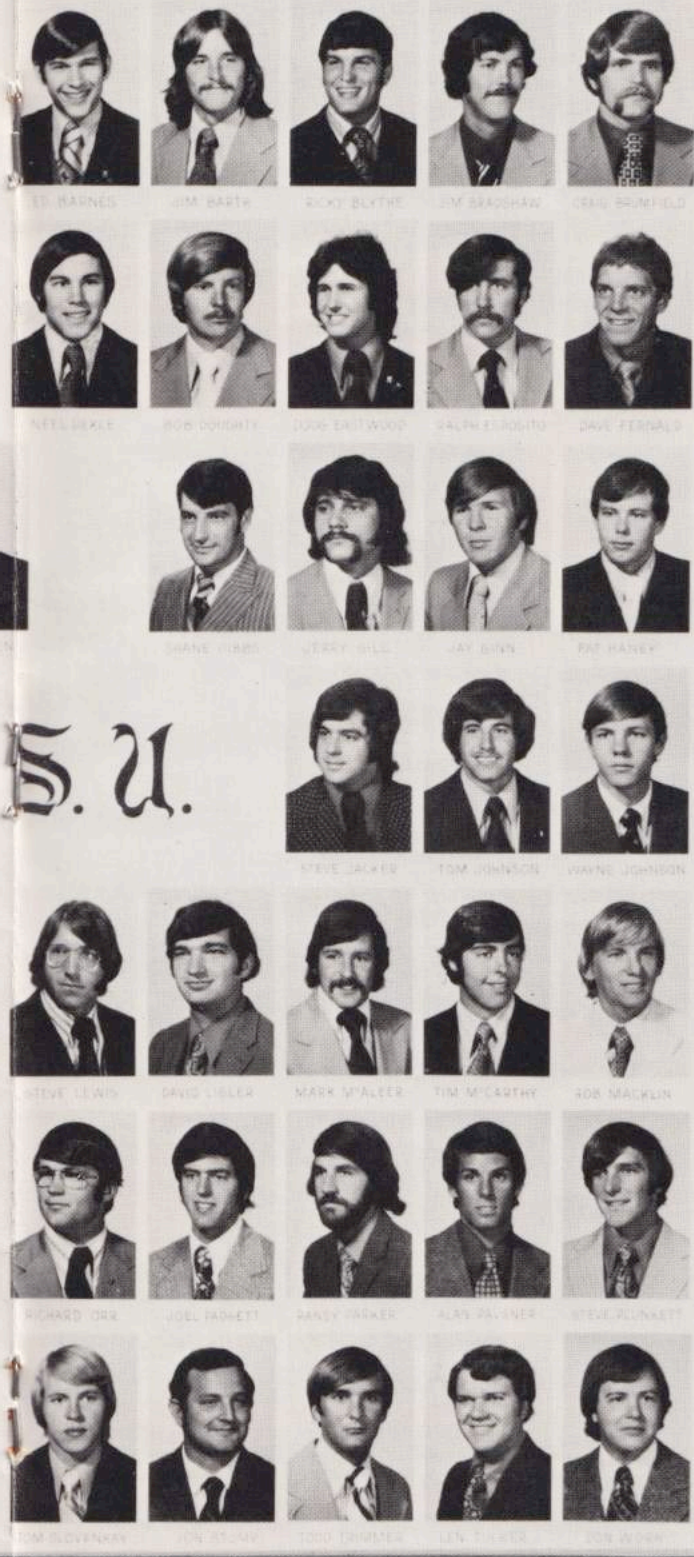

SORORITY SWEETHEART



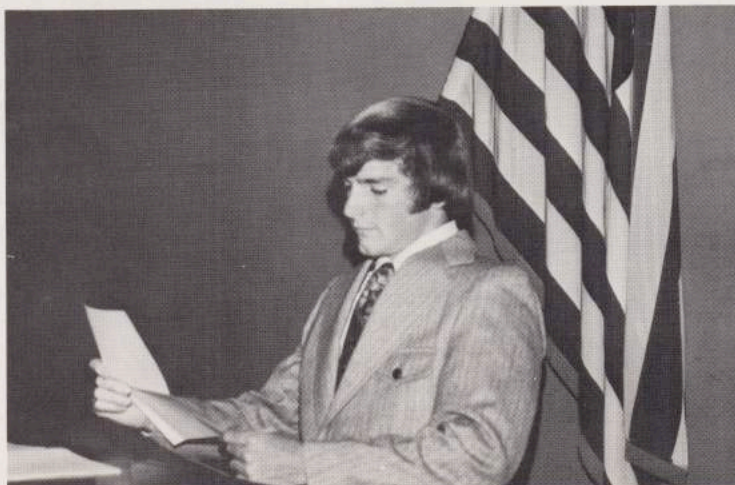

Sophomore Quarterback CRAIG BRUMFIELD led the PIKE intramural football team to the League Championship, and a 2nd Place finish for the season.

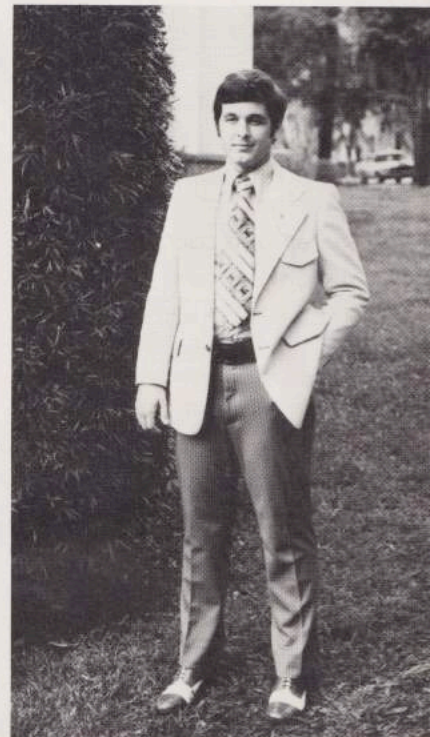

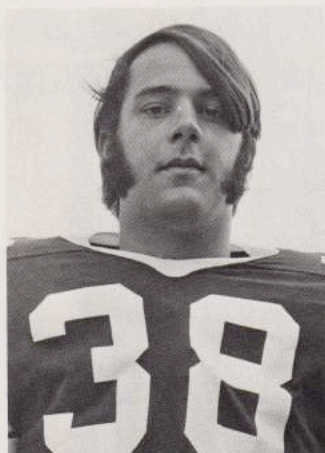


PGA ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

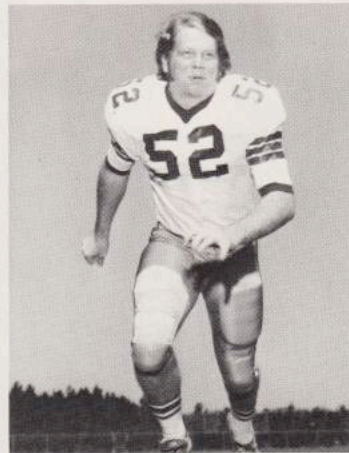
in 1972 is ex-Seminole HUBERT GREEN.

Hubert was an All-American at FSU then, as a rookie, took the Houston Open from veteran Don January in a sudden death thriller.

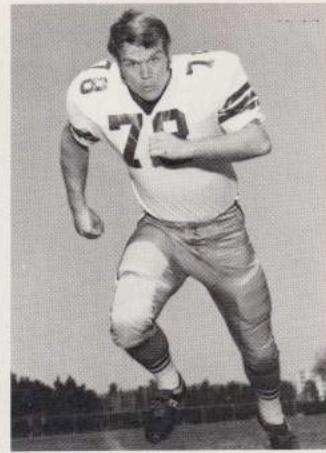
Hubert was president of his pledge class, and held several chapter offices including pledgemaster and sgt.-at-arms.

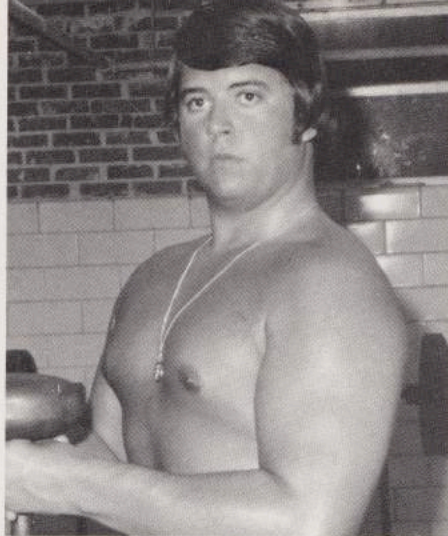

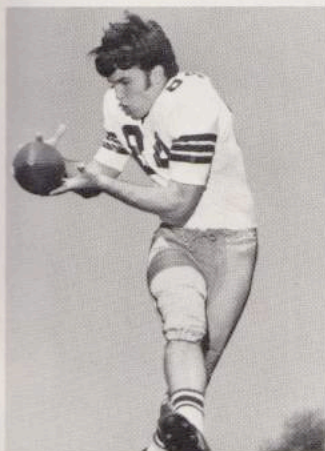

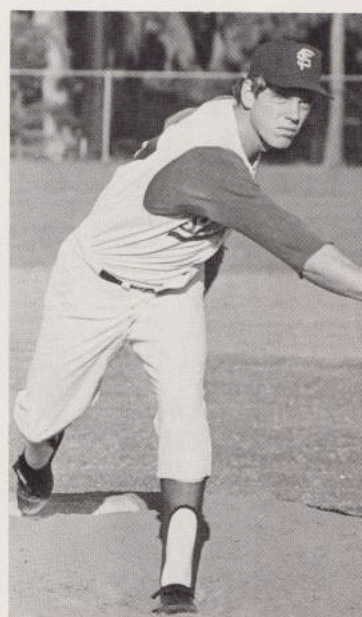

SEMINOLES FOR A QUARTER CENTURY



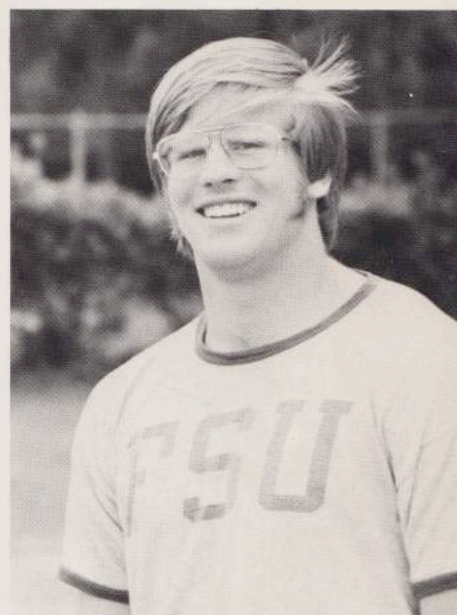
In September, 1947, Pi Kappa Alpha became one of the first three fraternities to organize at Florida State.

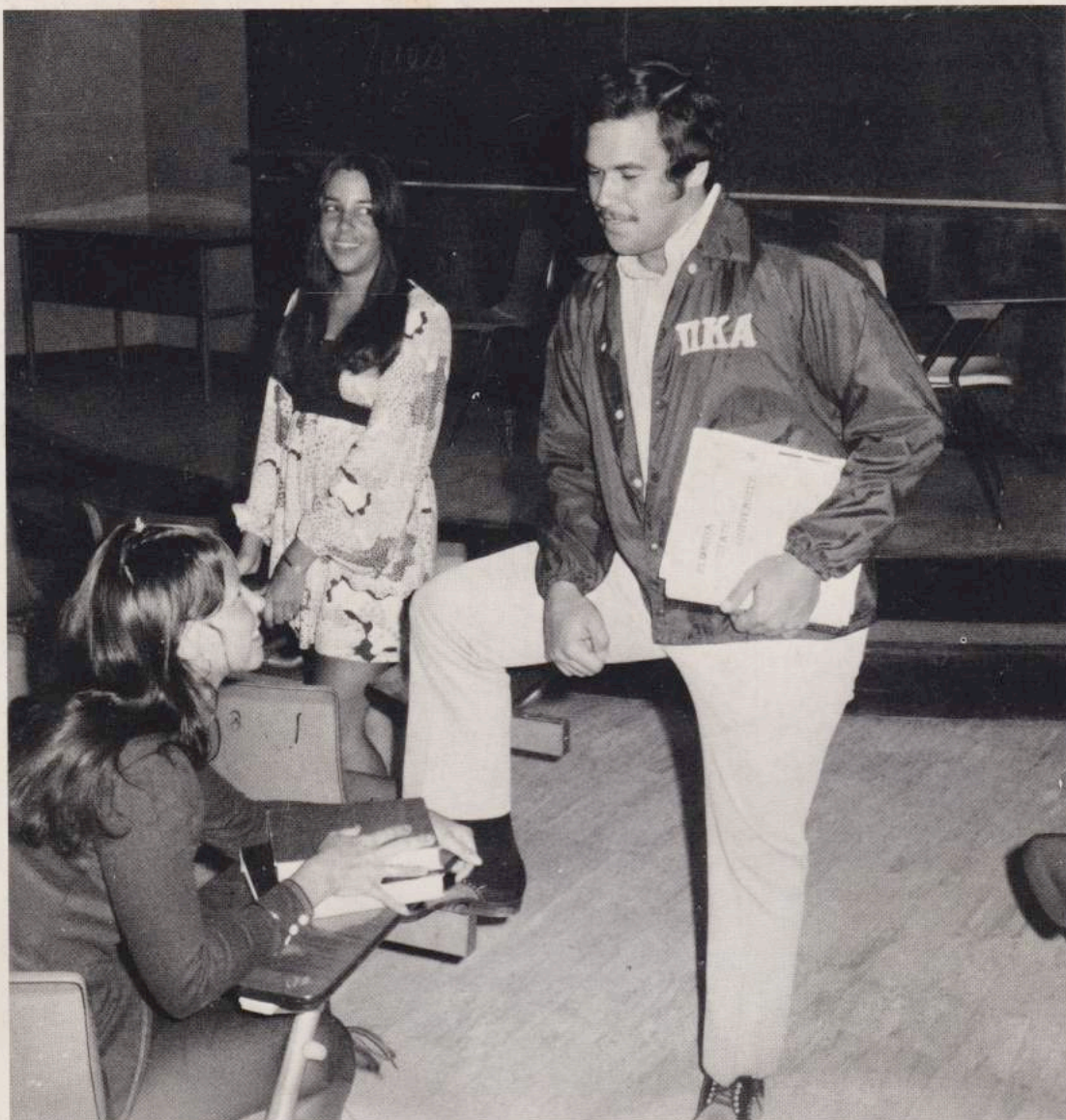
