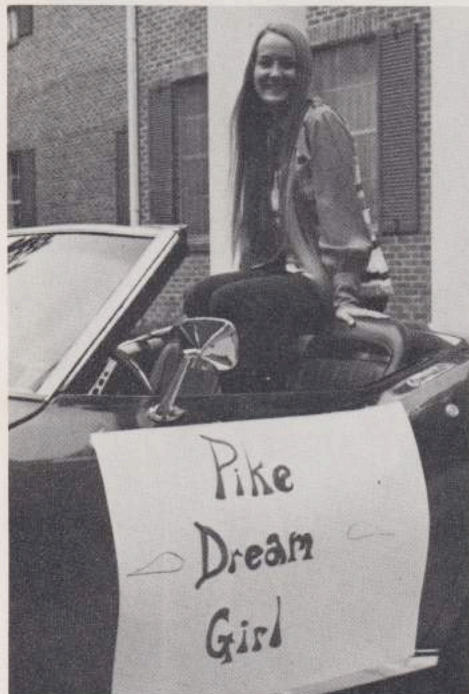

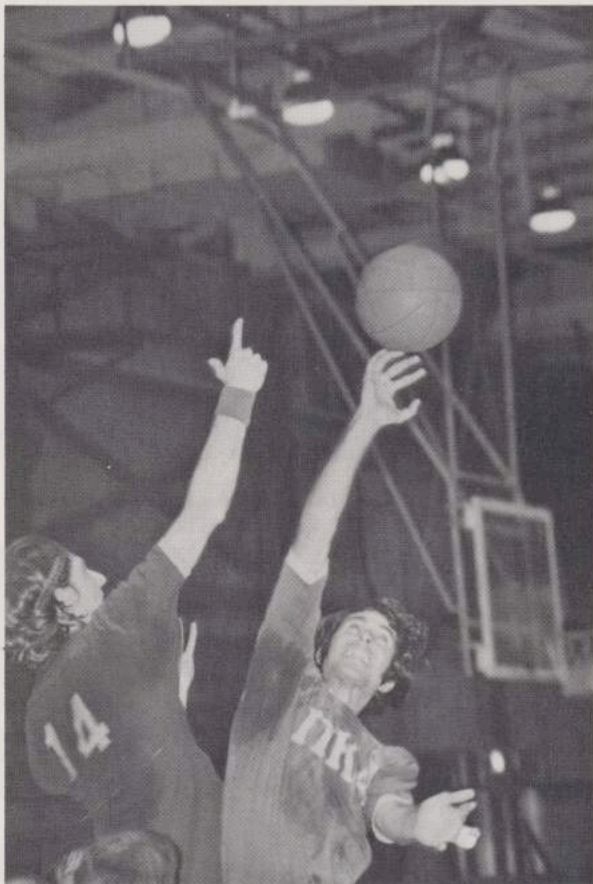

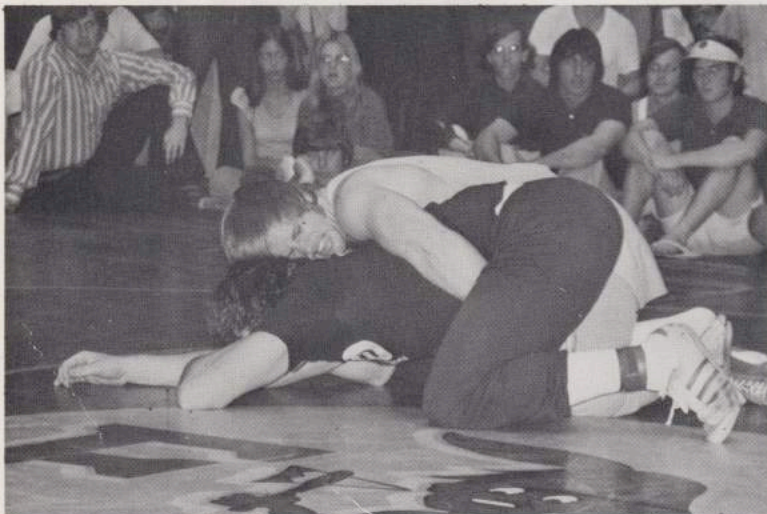


INTRAMURALS:

ΠΚΑ at FSU: A TRADITION OF SUCCESS

The fraternity system at Florida State was one year old and ΠΚΑ was the largest fraternity on campus with many members active in student government and leadership and scholastic honoraries. The Seminoles were the Dixie Conference champions that year, due in large part to the efforts of three ΠΚΑ brothers: end Norman Eubanks was the leading pass receiver; fullback Ken MacLean the top ground gainer; and tackle Hugh Adams became FSU's first football All-American when he was named to the Little All-America Team.

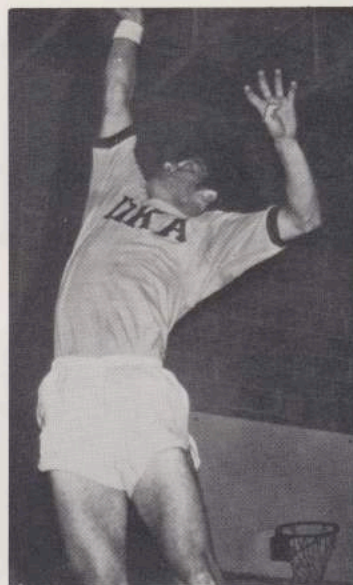

At the Cincinnati Convention in 1950 representatives from ΠΚΑ chapters throughout the country selected a National Sweetheart for the first time. They chose **Bobbie Pettit**, an FSU co-ed sponsored by our chapter. Bobbie was a member of KΑΘ sorority.



FSU had never had a *major* football All-American until wide-receiver **Tony Romeo**. Tony was captain of the 1959 Seminoles and later had a successful career with the Patriots. Nicknamed the "Space Age Viking" by an enthusiastic press, he was also an active fraternity man serving ΠΚΑ as chaplain and house manager.



Charlie Funk, now a coach in Coral Gables, set the All-School record for the most points scored by an individual in an intramural basketball game. Charlie officially scored an incredible 84 points during one game of the 1966 season. The record still stands.



Ex-Seminole **Hubert Green** was named "Rookie of the Year" by the Professional Golf Association. An All-American at FSU, his tournament wins include the Tallahassee Open and a sudden death victory over Don January in the Houston Open. Hubert was president of his pledge class and later served the fraternity as pledgemaster.

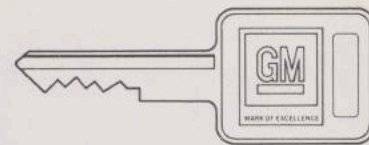
In 1973 the PIKES are still the leading fraternity on campus. At the end of this school year the PIKES had more members on varsity and sports club teams than any other fraternity, and counted among its membership more men who have been selected as sorority Men of the Year than any other fraternity. The annual PIKE Pig Roast, with an average attendance of 1500, is the largest event of its kind sponsored by any fraternity. The PIKES' tremendous social, athletic, financial, and fraternal successes this year prompted the most recent Advisor to Fraternities to cite Pi Kappa Alpha as "the best all-around fraternity on this campus."

- over \$11,000,000 in fraternity housing assets



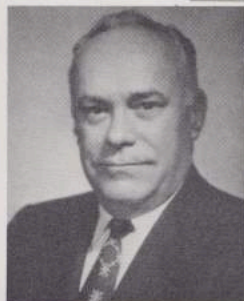

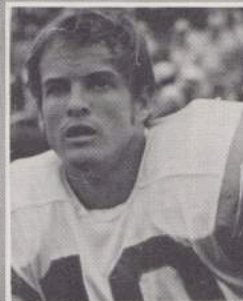

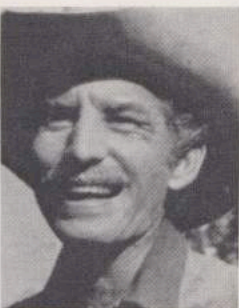

Senator Sparkman was President of the ΠΚΑ chapter at the University of Alabama where he was also a member of Phi Beta Kappa honor society. He has served as a U.S. Senator from Alabama for over thirty-five years and is now one of the most powerful men in Congress. About the values of ΠΚΑ membership, he says —
