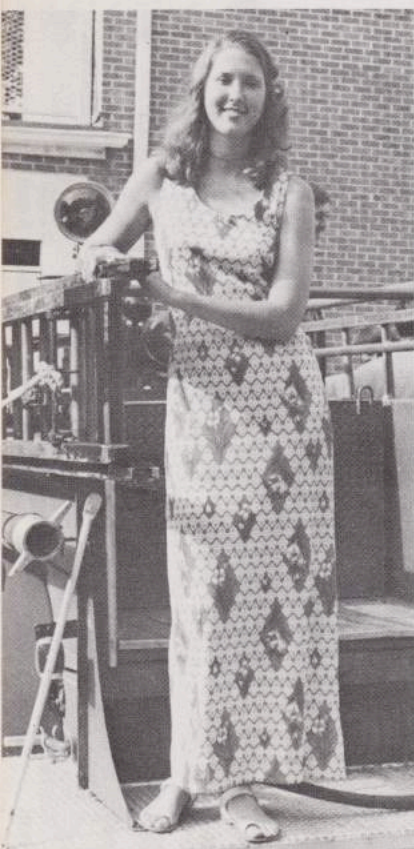

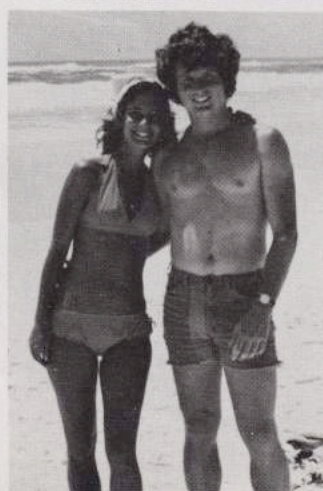
LITTLE SISTERS ^{OF THE} SHIELD & DIAMOND

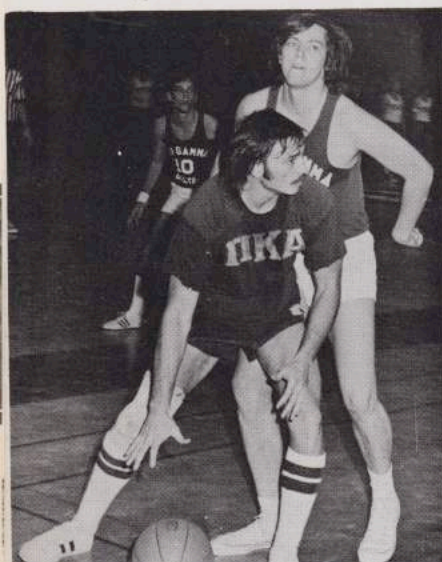

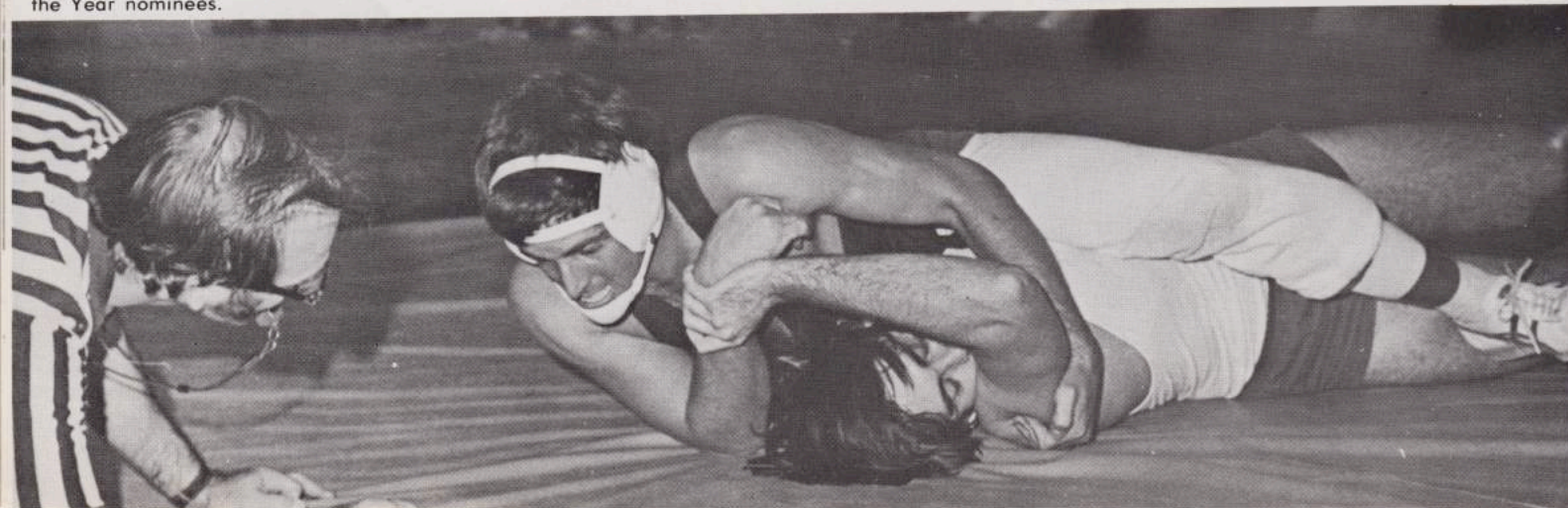

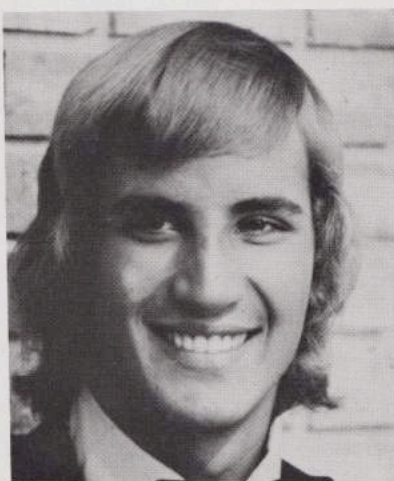
THE LADIES' CHOICE

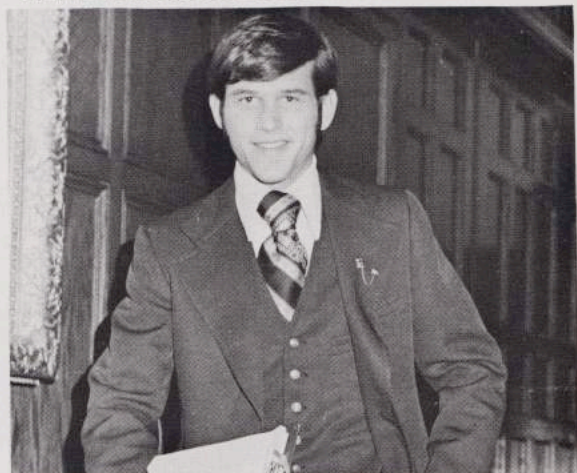

IT ALL BEGINS AT THE PIKE HOUSE

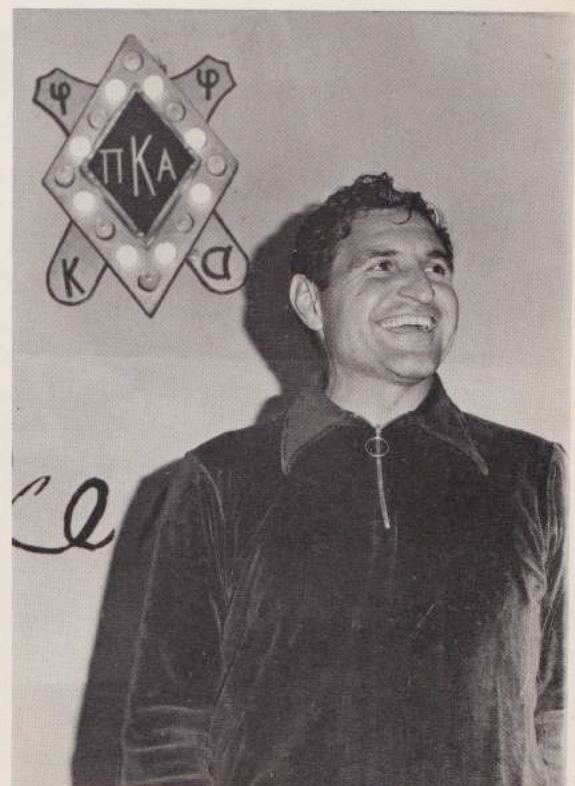
