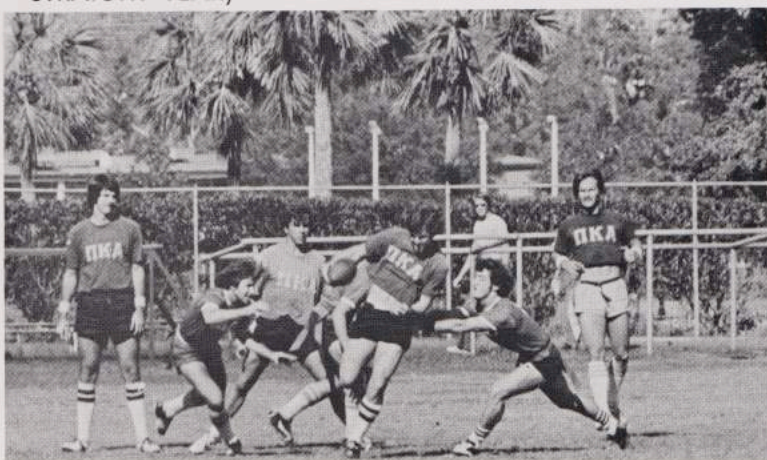

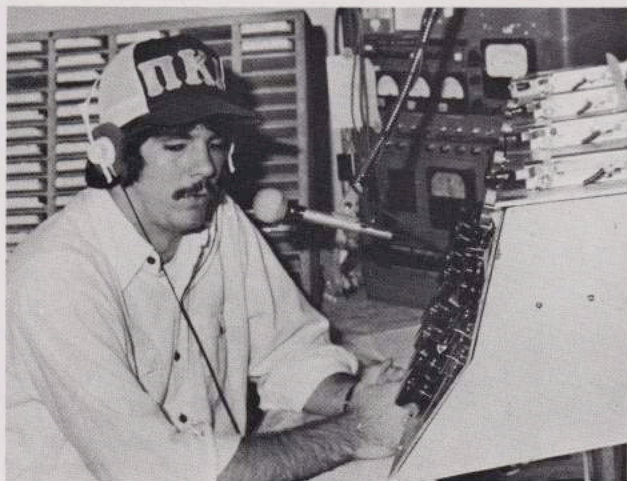
JIM CROOKE (left)... FSU Cheerleader and social chairman for Pi Kappa Alpha

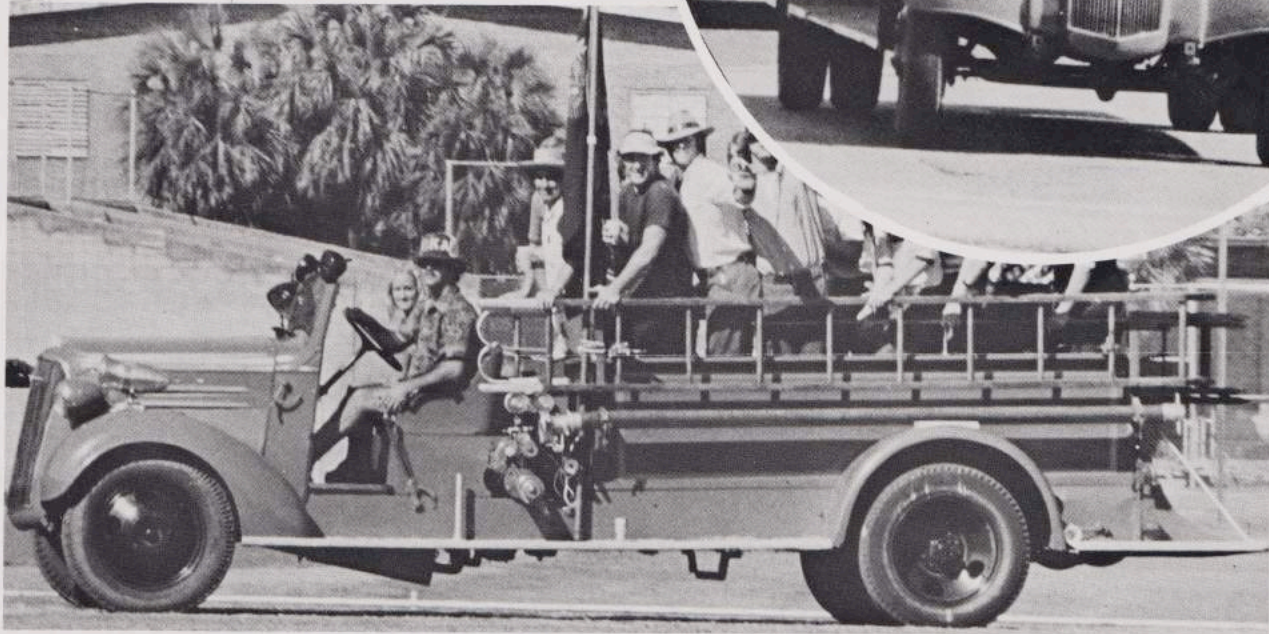


TRADITIONS

THE PIKE FIRETRUCK!

GIRLS LOVE IT; THE OTHER FRATERNITIES TRY TO IGNORE IT; OUR ALUMNI TELL STORIES ABOUT IT; AND WE USE IT FOR EVERYTHING FROM TRANSPORTING CHEERLEADERS TO TAKING A TURN AROUND CAMPUS AFTER DINNER.

The tradition began in 1899 when Pikes at Stewart College in Tennessee got one and adopted it as their trademark. It is a symbol of PIKE SPIRIT and enthusiasm. Today, well over half of the 175 Pike chapters in the nation have working firetrucks. Well, most of them work. Ours is a 1937 Chevrolet, fully restored and kept in running order by the Pike brothers.

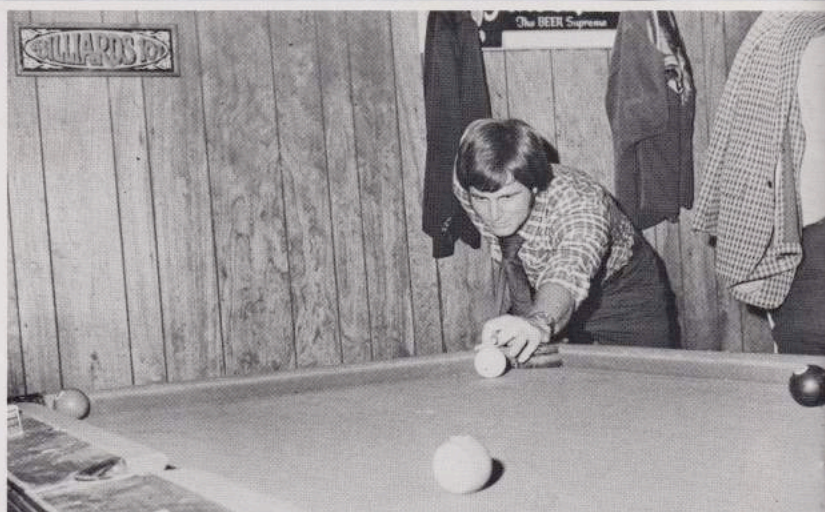

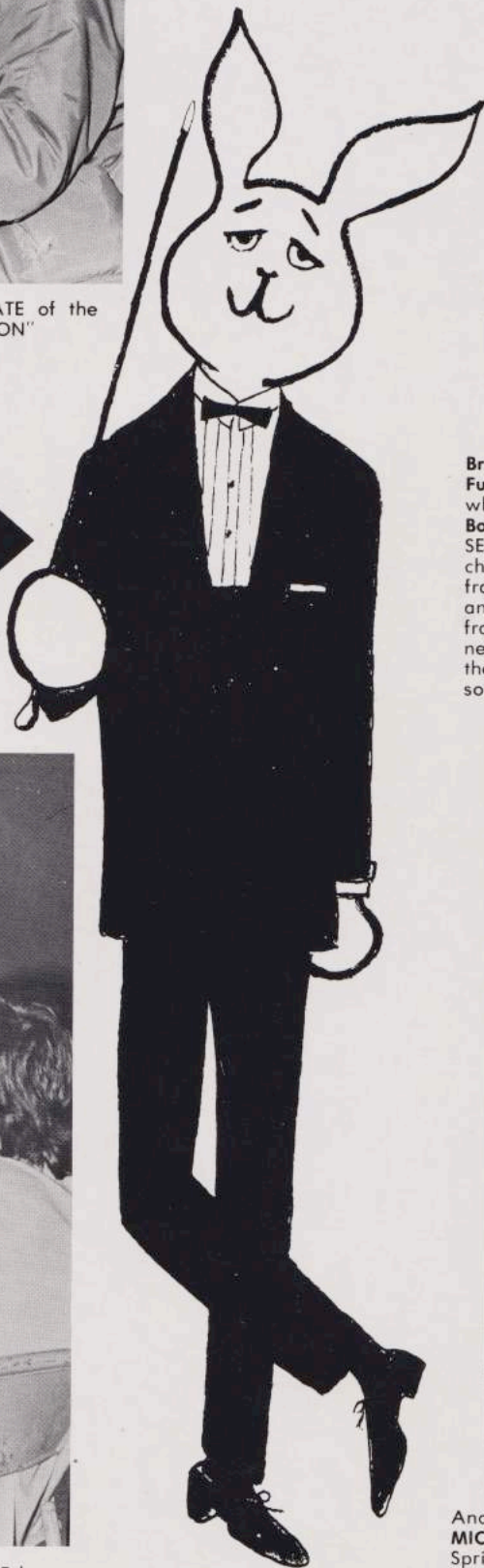

PLAYBOY PICKS THE PIKES



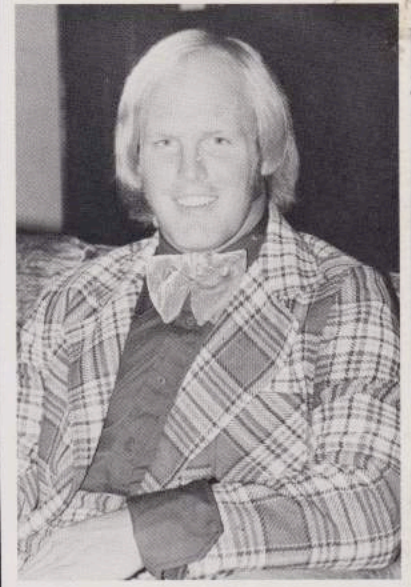
