
# NO PARTY...LIKE A PIKE PARTY





### 1978 - 1979

Ruben Lemes and Frank Hoover are elected members of the STUDENT SENATE, and both have been active in Student Government throughout their collegiate carreers.





#### **COACH BOBBY BOWDEN**



Head football coach BOBBY BOWDEN was initiated into Pi Kappa Alpha at Howard College (now Samford University) in 1948. He was an ALL-AMERICAN at quarterback in 1949, and is today one of the top college coaches in America.

#### THE PIKE ATHLETIC TRADITION

All the Pi Kappa Alpha Brothers pictured here participated in varsity or intercollegiate athletics at Florida State during the 1978-79 school year. This is one of the Fraternity's traditions of which we are most proud. Many of the Chapter's officers come from the ranks of our Seminole Athletes.

Pi Kappa Alpha has more varsity and intercollegiate athletes than any other fraternity, and at several times during the 1970s, we have had as many varsity athletes in our chapter as all the other fraternities combined!

This solid athletic tradition covers all of Florida State's 30-year history, from fullback KEN McLEAN, our Chapter founder, who caught the first completed pass in Seminole football history; to HUGH ADAMS, FSU's first All-American; to MONTE MAY, FSU's first six-letter man; to TONY ROMEO, the great All-American end of the 1950s, who had an eight year pro career with the Patriots; to HUBERT GREEN, golf pro and winner of the U.S. OPEN; to FRED MILLER, the first Seminole to letter under the NCAA Freshman rule in 1972; to the stars of today.


