

Footnote on the 1982-83 Intramural Season: Pikes were the Overall Intramural Champions in 1982, and were leading again at mid-year when events which later led to disciplinary action by the University resulted in the Pikes withdrawing from further serious competition. FLORIDA STATE PIKES *ALL-AMERICANS*

- 1949 HUGH ADAMS made the Paul B. Williamson Little All-America team at tackle, and became Florida State's first football All-American
- 1959 TONY ROMEO won All-America honors at end, and went on to a successful eight year career with the New England Patriots.
- 1968 HUBERT GREEN capped a brilliant college career with All-America honors, and then won PGA Rookie of the Year honors in 1970
- 1972 BARRY SMITH: AP, UPI and KODAK Coaches' consensus All-America receiver; was Green Bay Packers' "NFL Man of the Year" in 1975
- 1979 PHIL WILLIAMS: three times named Scholastic All-America wide receiver, Phil graduated with a 3.8 GPA in accounting.
- 1979 BOB CORNELY, N.A.I.A. All-American swimmer / Butterfly
- 1980 SCOTT WARREN, the Tribe's great defensive end, won 1st team Scholastic All-America honors and 3rd Team AP All-America. He was the 1977 Tangerine Bowl MVP as a sophomore, and later signed with Dallas as a free agent. He is currently in medical
- 1980 MIKE RENDINA became the only high school kicker ever to be named to the prestigous PARADE ALL-AMERICAN team.
- 1981 MIKE FUENTES became the leading homerun hitter in college baseball history, and was twice named All-America. He is currently with the Expo's AAA club, and hopes to move into the majors this fall.

THE FAMOUS PIKE FIRETRUCK...


