

Tracy passed into Chapter Eternal on June 1, 2019. He was a practicing attorney in Sarasota. Tracy was also certified by the American Polygraph Association, by the NBLS Board Criminal Law and he was an NRA instructor. In addition, he owned Equestria Quarter Horse Ranch, the home of the World Champion Quarter Horse "Captain". But while the Law was his profession, Tracy's passion was teaching and coaching wrestling. He was thrilled to have just recently been named the Head Wrestling Coach for Sarasota High School and for the AAU/ Sunshine State Games.

Tracy died doing what he loved. Sportswriter Mark Palmer described the scene: "Tracy Lee passed away after taking on a college-age opponent at the Sunshine State Games in West Palm Beach, Fla. on Saturday. Lee, who just last month became head wrestling coach at Sarasota High School, took some of his wrestlers to the Sunshine State Games, which had wrestling competitions for a wide range of age groups, up to age 70. Lee pulled on a Sarasota Sailor singlet and faced off against a college-age competitor who was the Ukrainian national champion in Greco-Roman wrestling, according to assistant coach Cam Holland.

"The place is crowded, there are five mats, a huge gym, and when Tracy and this man started wrestling, everybody circled the mat," Holland told the Sarasota Herald-Tribune. "It was like five rows deep and when they got done wrestling, everybody

just stood and clapped. That was a match. That was respect. It was a championship-caliber match." Not long after the match ended, Lee collapsed and was taken to nearby hospital, where he died of an apparent heart attack. How fine would it be to know that our life's journey would end with both a smile and a victory.

"Tracy was a very positive source in the Pike House. I am sure everyone remembers that he moved into the house as a "Pledge". We knew he was tough and a little crazy too! The lesson for me is to reconnect with my Brothers while we are living and not during times like these." Steve Lowsky '84 "It's so bizarre. As you know, I live in St. Petersburg, about an hour north of Sarasota and heard nothing about Tracy's passing on June 1st. Then, Joanne and I were in the Sarasota Yacht Club having lunch on Saturday, June 8th, and I walked past a table set up in the main dining room. The pictures of the table are attached. I said to Joanne, "hey, that's my fraternity brother and friend Tracy Lee". At first glance, I thought he was hosting a fundraiser or something along those lines. Joanne grabbed my arm and said "oh no, this is not good". I looked closer and clearly saw that it was a memorial. I was absolutely heartbroken. "Note in the picture the Pi K A teddy bear on the table. That bear was given to him upon by his big sister upon his initiation. The pic in his wrestling tights was what he looked like when we were pledges. In 1986, Tracy drove a white BMW 325i which, along with Chad Johnson's ('85) same car in red, and a couple of other 3 series BMW's owned by other brothers, went into the homecoming parade that year. I think we sang Randy Newman's "It's lonely at the top" over and over as we drove along the parade route. Those were good times and will live on in our hearts forever. "As a side note, you'll notice in the links above that Cam Holland '87 was one of the pall bearers. He was also in Tracy's pledge class.

"Times like these always make me reflect on how truly blessed we all are to be Delta Lambda Pikes and how our experiences as such has enriched all of our lives. "Life is so precious! Talbot "Sandy" D'Alemberte

No, he was not a Delta Lambda Pike; Sandy was a member of Alpha Tau Omega at The University of the South (Sewanee). But as President of Florida State University, Sandy D'Alemberte's contribution to the renewal, strength and prosperity of Delta Lambda was arguably as important as that of Ed Cubbon '29. Sandy and his wife Patsy Palmer were driving home to Tallahassee following a long stay in hospital at Mayo Clinic. Sandy had a knee replacement, an operation usually without too much risk, but Sandy had a history of heart problems. What should have been a short stay turned into several weeks; doctors were working to stabilize the various medical issues.\*\*

If it is true that the definition of happiness is having something to look forward to, then could we ask for any better end to Life's journey than for it to find us while we are smiling and relaxing on the way home after a long and difficult passage. Though tempting, this is not the venue to recount all the vicious intrigue and conspiracies of hatred that schemed to keep Pike from returning to FSU, and that, once Pike was re-established, continued to maneuver to destroy the colony.

Delta Lambda was suspended in 1988. The fraternity continued to exist as the Pike Firemen until 1994. Although Pike National revoked our Charter, the University's suspension order did not preclude the Fraternity from continuing to operate independently, specifying only that the fraternity was no longer officially recognized. In fact, Phi Delta Theta was suspended at the same time as Pike, and Phi Delt continued to operate off campus with approval of their National. Since those days, the University has tightened the language of suspension to specify that a suspended fraternity cannot continue to exist at all. While of questionable legality regarding freedom of association, the University's ace card is their ability to threaten the offending National that they will not be allowed to return at all unless all of their undergrads disassociate from each other.

Pike National sought to establish a colony in 1993, despite the firestorm of organized opposition from the usual suspects. New recruits and the Firemen were combined and the colony flourished, embraced by the sororities despite pressure from outside. Trouble in the spring of 1994 motivated National to shut down the colony, and the Firemen disbanded. National then sold our house to the Phi Delts. In the fall of 1999, then University President Sandy D'Alemberte asked to sit down in his office with Andy Miller '70 and Charlie Barnes '65, President and Executive Director respectively of Seminole Boosters, Inc. Sandy was excited about the concept of creating a beautiful new park with fraternity housing in order to allow expansion of campus facilities.

Andy Miller's reputation as a visionary leader was already well established, and Sandy asked the two men to take on the challenge of creating the new fraternity park. They agreed, but also mentioned that the task would be more appealing if their own fraternity was once again part of the University.

"We'd like for you, as president, to invite us back," they said. D'Alemberte replied, "I cannot unilaterally invite you to come back, but I will invite you to re-apply for admission as a fraternity." And knowing the political landscape as he did, Sandy added, "And, I will make sure you get a fair shake."

True to his word, D'Alemberte put out of the word to his student affairs administrators that there would be no more sabotage or back room intrigues as had been in play under the previous President in 1993.

Two more pieces of the plan were absolutely vital to ensure success of the comeback. It was anticipated that Pike's return would be opposed so, first, a paragon of purity and integrity and had to be recruited to represent the Fraternity letters to the public. Doug Russell '79 fit the bill perfectly. The Tampa businessman had recently moved his family to Tallahassee. Doug was a past SMC and previously worked for a year as a Chapter Consultant for National. Doug accepted the role of President of the Delta Lambda Alumni Association, and became the public 'face' of the Fraternity. He met with President D'Alemberte to formally ask for the invitation to return. "Sandy was incredibly gracious," said Doug, "and told me that he would allow our application and approve our return."

The second piece of the plan was to secure a committed alumnus who had extensive knowledge of fraternity mechanics to serve as both Colony and Chapter Advisor. Ed Barnes '71 had moved back to Tallahassee from Dallas in 1998 to take a job with the State of Florida. In Dallas, he had guided the Pike Chapter at SMU from

near-non-existence to a Smythe Award winner. Ed took over the FSU Advisor role in 2000, and was named National Chapter Advisor of the Year in 2005 by the National Fraternity.

On campus, during the application process Pike passed through the appropriate committees without much notice or challenge, staying below the radar. Troublemakers among the administrators had been put on notice. Alumni of other fraternities stepped forward to voice their support for the Pikes. However, in one case one man composed a violently hateful letter and sent to the entire mailing list of Theta Chi Fraternity alumni, claiming that he himself was a Pike and threatening their wives and children.

D'Alemberte engaged FSU Police investigators who were able to track down and identify the individual, a member of another fraternity, who was subsequently fired from his career job at Amazon.

There were more vicious, terrible and unrelenting attacks on our alumni and undergrads, some orchestrated by activist FSU faculty members. D'Alemberte responded by hosting 'Meet the Pikes Night' in his splendid President's Box above Doak Campbell Stadium. Sandy knew some of the new Pike members personally from his work with current students, notably 1999 Homecoming Chief Eli Nortelus '01, as well as young alumni like Scott Keller '88 who had been among his students in Law School. In fairness, it should be noted that the young woman in charge of Greek Life at the time became overwhelmingly supportive of the colony's quality and vision.

After serving a decade as FSU President, Sandy stepped into his role as Dean of the Law School where he continued until retirement. He was always a friend of Delta Lambda and to many of our alumni.

Henry Kissinger is credited with the observation that, "Academic politics are so vicious precisely because the stakes are so small." Although we smile with understanding based on our experience, in this case the stakes for Pi Kappa Alpha were huge. Sandy remained above all the pettiness and partisanship to ensure the right thing was done.

If it were not for the courage and honor and morality of Sandy D'Alemberte, there would have been no return of Delta Lambda to Florida State.

On Sunday, May 26 our own Clint Wallace '01, now an established Tallahassee

attorney, authored an op-ed piece in the Tallahassee Democrat calling for Legislature to re-name the FSU Law School for D'Alemberte. That sentiment surely would find support among the men of Delta Lambda.

His strength and defiance in the face of the mob will never be forgotten. He is already missed.

RIP at age 85.
