Final night of rush, 2016. Here are 58 of our 60+ fall pledges. Rush Chairman Steven McFall is seated in front, center.



# **Copies of Pikes Illustrated 2016 Are Now Available**

This 2016 edition of the most renowned fraternity rush publication in America marks the 45th year since the magazine was first published following the 1971-1972 school year highlighting the achievements of Delta Lambda. Sixteen annual editions were published in the 1970s and 1980s plus a 17th (1988) edition which was laid out and prepared with photos but left unpublished. Since the Chapter returned during the 1999-2000 school year, 16 more annual issues have been published.



**Ed Barnes** '71 named the original version **Pikeboy**. It became the most popular and widely imitated rush magazine in the country in the 1970s and 1980s. As many as fifty Pike chapters published their own versions of Pikeboy during those years.

When Delta Lambda re-chartered in 2000 the decision was made to change the name of the magazine but not the format. Fundamental elements of the original 1971-72 format have never varied. The name **Pikes Illustrated** was seen as a better fit for the Chapter in the new era.

Charlie served on the Pike National staff and subsequently as National Rush Director. In the 1980s he was elected to the Fraternity's Supreme Council twice. He is the author of The Bowden Dynasty and is pictured above with his wife Connie.


# Other Pikes Already in the Florida State Hall of Fame:



**Bobby Bowden '49** (Alpha Pi Chapter, Samford University)


Coach Bowden was twice elected SMC of Alpha Pi Chapter at Samford. He was football and track captain, and Little All-American quarterback for Samford. His son **Jeff Bowden** '80 is a Delta Lambda Plke, and his grandson **Michael Madden** '14 is also a Delta Lambda. Michael's father was the late **John Madden** '78.

Red Dawson '97 (shown with actor Matthew Fox)
This story is pretty interesting. Red Dawson was played by actor
Matthew Fox in the movie 'We Are Marshall'. Dawson was the Marshall Coach who survived the plane crash because he was on a





recruiting trip. Bill 'Red' Dawson was All-American at both tight end and defensive end at Florida State, playing 1961 through 1964. Although he left the Marshall coaching staff in 1972, he remains in business in Huntington. Both of his sons went to Marshall and were Pikes (**Jeffrey Dawson '94** and **William Dawson'96**). They initiated Red Dawson into the Marshall chapter of PiKA in 1997. A metal sculpture in the front yard of the Pike house stands as a memorial to the PiKA football players who died in the Marshall team plane crash in 1970.




### Mike Fuentes '78

At the time, he was the greatest homerun hitter in college baseball history. Mike won the Golden Spikes Award in 1981, signifying the top college baseball player in America. After the new house opened in 2006, Mike presented his Award to the chapter to be housed in the lobby trophy case. A Sports Illustrated feature on him began, "Mike Fuentes was just another walk-on jock living on the second floor of Florida State's Pi Kappa Alpha house..." Mike's nephew just pledged and is vice president of this fall's class.

### **Hubert Green '65**

As an undergrad, Hubert held several Chapter offices including Pledgemaster; his older brother **Maurice Green '64** was a Pike at the University of Alabama. Hubert was PGA Rookie of the Year in 1971 and then went on to a spectacular career which included winning the 1977 U.S. Open and the 1985 PGA Championship. He was inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame in 2007. His Pike fraternity pin is surrounded by all green emeralds.

### Richie Lewis '86


All-American pitcher Richie Lewis was drafted in 1987, rose through the ranks and pitched seven years in the Major Leagues, from 1992 through 1998. There is an ESPN still photo on display in the **Russell Legends Room** of Richie and his Freshman All-American catcher **Barry Blackwell '86** flying through

the air in a chest-butting celebration during the 1987 College World Series.

### Bill Parker '49

Billy Parker was the first FSU student-athlete to letter in three sports: football, basketball and baseball. He founded the Crest Products Company in Oldsmar, Florida in 1961 and remains President of the Parker Family Corporation. He was a charter member of the Golden Chiefs in 1975 and served as Chairman of the Board of Seminole Boosters in 1986, and Chairman of the Booster Scholarship Endowment.





### Tony Romeo '59

All-American tight end and Seminole team captain, Romeo played eight seasons for the Boston Patriots. He made regular appearances at Bobby Bowden Day events and was a loyal Delta Lambda Pike until his death. Tony was an early leader of the evangelical movement among professional football players and during the off season and after his retirement he traveled widely speaking in Southern Baptist and other evangelical churches. Romeo is also recognized as the man who began the first chapel services in professional football.

Barry Smith '72 (shown here with son Andrew Smith '10)

Barry was an All-American wide receiver and first round NFL draft pick in 1973. He was a persistent fundraiser during the **Legends Campaign** and he remains active in all Delta Lambda events. Barry retired from the NFL in 1976 after playing four seasons for the Packers and the Bucs. **He is President of the Florida Sports Hall of Fame**. Andrew Smith played four years of football for Georgia Tech



before transferring to FSU for Law School and pledging his dad's fraternity.



### Dr. Scott Warren '77

Scott was an All-American defensive end in 1979 and an Academic All-American. A member of Coach Bowden's first team in 1976, he started every game for four years and was MVP of the Tangerine Bowl vs. Texas Tech in 1977. Dr. Warren is now a distinguished dermatologist in Jacksonville, married to former Little Sister Beth Billingsley, the cover of our first color edition of Pikeboy in 1982.

### Gene Deckerhoff '14

Seldom has there ever been a more exuberant new initiate than Gene Deckerhoff! He was invited to join the Brotherhood in 2014 and was enthusiastic to say the least. Since initiation Gene has remained a steadfast and loyal PiKA, offering The Challenge to every Brother he sees. He is the 'Voice' of both the Seminoles and the Tampa Bay Bucs. He was inducted into the Florida Sports Hall of Fame in 2000 and has been named Florida Sportscaster of the Year 14 times by members of the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association. And for 18 consecutive years Gene was named the Best Play-by-Play Announcer in Florida by the Florida Sportscasters Association.




