

This loving remembrance courtesy of Griff Siegel '78:

As a high school All-American in both football and track, and Golden Gloves boxing champion, it was obvious that Brian McCrary was an athlete with superior, Godgiven talent, who competed with exceptional focus and intensity. He was routinely recognized by television commentators for his full-speed, bone-jarring hits on the gridiron, particularly when providing run support. "Boom Boom" as they called him was a human battering ram, often forcing even the toughest receivers and running backs to the sidelines for a few plays of recovery time, and causing them to tread lightly whenever they entered his zone thereafter.

Leading the nation in interceptions his junior season only enhanced Brian's status as a force to be reckoned with in the Seminoles' defensive backfield. Opposing coaches had to plan their game strategy away from him while receivers whose routes took them through his zone tried very hard to avoid him. Few were successful.

What most Seminole fans were not privy to, however, was what a great guy Brian was. Behind the tough-as-nails public exterior was a man of solid character and a proud Delta Lambda brother; a guy who met his pledge responsibilities without hesitation or complaint, joined his fellow Neos during Hell Week as much as his football schedule would allow and later becoming a regular presence at chapter meetings during the off-season. As a varsity athlete, he happily lent his credibility in the locker room to the chapter's Rush efforts at Coble Terrace, including helping Pike pledge the young stud Defensive End John McLean '82, with whom Brian remained close for the remainder of his life. As an active Brother, he played on several Pike intramural teams, was always a gentlemanly representative of the chapter whenever visiting "his girls" at the ADPi house, and an enthusiastic participant in off-season lawn parties and social events. In short, Brian McCrary was "a good Pi K A."

He was also my Little Brother.

Dan Mensch '81 and I were privileged to meet/recruit/pledge Brian while we were attending an event at PiKA National HQ in Memphis. He was recommended to Charlie Barnes by Brother Billy Campbell '73 who lived in Memphis and knew Brian's older brother, Conrad, a local sports legend. BC brought us all together at the McCrary home for an introduction.

Then, Dan, Brian and I were released to explore the wonders of Beale Street and beyond! For three nights, Brian showed us how to party in Memphis like the local hero that he was! Although, still a senior at Germantown High, it became abundantly clear very quickly that Brian was as much of a legend as his older brother. He was known all over town. There was not a single club or restaurant where we didn't bypass the line of "unknowns" waiting outside, routinely benefitting from immediate acknowledgment by the doorman and the related no-cover-charge-needed entry. EVERYONE knew Brian. In the days before social media, recognition on that level was very unusual, especially for a high school phenomenon. As humble as he was talented, Brian took it all in stride. Never let it go to his head.

Our three-night imbibe-a-thon included a blurry-eyed, slurred-word meeting with Bob Hope and Arnold Palmer, which was awesome, Mensch's consumption of a gallon-sized paint bucket of what I'm pretty sure was fruit punch-flavored jet fuel, and, finally, my putting a Pike pledge pin on Brian's chest between too many nickel beers at Silky Sullivan's, a legendary Memphis hot spot located just a few miles from PiKA National HQ, which we drove past in the wee-morning hours after Brian's pledging! Very cool!

I was honored when Brian asked me to be his big brother that Fall, and very proud of the Brother he became in our chapter. After college, he went on to become a loyal husband, caring father and hard-working, successful businessman. In 2008, he was diagnosed with Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis ("ALS"), the same disease that victimized such well-known personalities as Stephen Hawking and NY Yankees Hall-Of-Famer Lou Gherig.

ALS is a progressive neurological disorder that affects nerve cells in the spinal cord, interrupting the brain's signals to muscles throughout the body. As the disease progresses, victims lose the ability to stand, grasp things, raise their arms, or even hold themselves upright in a chair without supports. Gradually, they become unable to swallow or speak and, eventually, to breathe. The cause is not known, and sadly there is no cure.

It's a slow, demoralizing, difficult way to die, and Brian knew what he was facing. His response was the same as it was for everything else in his life: He faced it head on, publicly, without complaint. He worked hard to maintain his physical independence as long as possible and did his best to keep a smile on his face. The world could use a lot more people like Brian McCrary. He was a good guy. And, as it pertains to Delta Lambda ... as Ed Cubbon would ask of us: He was a good Pi K A. Rest in peace, Brian.
