PIKES OF THE 1960s REUNION:

November 11 - 13, 2021



"Pikes of the '60s" Alumni Boarding their Luxury Private Bus to the Miami Game

Eight months of planning were inspired by a Zoom call on Founders Day, March 1st, 2021. **Bob Tunkel '66** began to locate and assemble as many Pikes from his era as possible, with the idea of creating a way to re-establish connections. A few of the Brothers had not seen or spoken to each other in 50 years.

FSU fraternity chapters in the 1960s were not a large as they are today. An average fraternity might have had 50 members; the largest ones topped out at around 75. In the decade of the 1960s, Delta Lambda initiated approximately 220 men. Of those – the men initiated between 1960 and 1969 – 50 have now passed into Chapter Eternal.

Delta Lambda alumni from every era have proven to be very loyal to the Fraternity, through their leadership, and through their generosity by contributing to the Old Guard.

One of the most enduring contributions of the 1960s alumni was their devotion to being '**Legacy Dads'**, by introducing their sons to Pi Kappa Alpha.

Bob Tunkel '66 embraced the role of Reunion Chairman, and the weekend of the Miami game was selected. Good fortune followed the Pikes. **Charlie Barnes '65** was able to secure a large block of rooms at the Hilton Garden Inn located just inside I-10. The hotel was so happy with the months-early guarantee that they offered a substantial reduced room-rate for the Pikes, and their staff was exceptionally helpful with planning our events.

Getting tickets to the Miami game would be challenging, but **Jim Riscino '64** was able to persuade the University to set aside a block of tickets just for Pike alumni in the fabulous Al Dunlap Champions Club overlooking the stadium. Through Jim's influence, we were able to get a discounted rate for this game.

Some Pike alumni already have Seminole Booster parking for football games. But for those who had no transportation, **Jack McMullen '64** engaged a luxury bus to take the party from the hotel to the game and then return afterward.

This was an extraordinarily successful weekend with many special memories.

- -- Jim Poe '66 and Bob Tunkel '66 arranged to purchase a number of official, specially minted Pi Kappa Alpha Challenge Coins. The coin is intended to initiate the Ritual Challenge when one Pike meets another, and secret phrases are exchanged to prove authenticity.
- -- As guests arrived on Thursday, Brothers and their spouses gathered in the hotel lobby/bar to reminisce and exchange tales of days past.
- -- On Friday, the undergraduate Chapter hosted a number of alumni on a tour of the 'New' Pike house. There is a photo below showing some of them posing by the 'new'

-- Struck by the sudden death of **Ray Hayes '62**, the hotel was kind enough to livestream Ray's Funeral Mass on Friday for the Brothers to see.

- -- The names of 50 Brothers from the 1960s who have entered Chapter Eternal were read aloud.
- -- **Jim Poe '66** asked individual alumni in turn to come to the front where each was presented with a Challenge Coin. Each coin is engraved with 'Once a Pike; Always a Pike'.
- -- Dave Orr '62 presented beautiful, hand-crafted pledge paddles to the Brothers.

- --- **Bob Tunkel '66** was presented with a beautifully engraved plaque recognizing the 'Pikes of the 60s' appreciation of his leadership.
- -- **John Stoner '64**, owner of the Stoner Organization, brother of **Bob Stoner '64** and father of **Rob Stoner '88**, made a presentation outlining the pathway for alumni to make estate or insurance gifts directly to support the physical chapter house facility (The Legends of Delt Lambda). John is one of only four Delta Lambda alumni leaders entrusted with this initiative.

Former Florida State All-American, Major League Baseball star and FSU Hall of Fame inductee **Richie Todd Lewis '86** entered Chapter Eternal on December 7th, 2021. Richie and fellow All-American (and Pike) **Barry Blackwell '86** put on a show in the 1986 College World Series. Lewis was the leading pitcher in the Series, and Blackwell was the leading hitter. Richie was FSU's All-Time Strike-Out King with 520 to his credit.


"Former Florida State pitcher Richie Lewis, known for his fiery competitiveness and electric fastball, has died, according to his family Wednesday.

"Lewis, a 5-foot-7 right-hander, was considered one of the best pitchers to ever take the mound at FSU.

"He recorded a school-record 520 strikeouts over three seasons (1985-87) and helped lead the Seminoles to consecutive World Series appearances.

"A second-round draft selection, Lewis played seven years in the majors before being forced to retire due to injury. "Lewis, 55, lived in Melbourne and was married with three grown children.

"Richie made a lot of kids want to play and a lot of adults want to watch college baseball," FSU baseball coach Mike Martin Jr. said Wednesday.



"He was dominant on the mound but his infectious personality is what many friends will remember most. He was a loyal friend that will be missed dearly. Our thoughts and prayers go out to Andrea and the kids."
