Dr. Joe O'Shea '04 Named FSU's New Dean of Undergraduate Studies

In his new role. O'Shea will serve as academic dean for most freshmen and sophomores until they are admitted to an upper-division major. He will oversee more than a dozen departments and programs, including the Presidential Scholars and Honors programs, which work with FSU's most high-achieving students, and the Center for Academic Retention & Enhancement (CARE), which serves traditionally underrepresented students.

A Truman and Rhodes Scholar, O'Shea has a master's degree in comparative social policy and a Ph.D. in education from the University of Oxford. He is the author of the forthcoming books "Doing College Right: A Guide to Student Success," published by Columbia University Press, and "Gap Year: How Delaying College Changes People in Ways the World Needs," published by Johns Hopkins University Press.

In 2007, Joe was elected FSU Student Body President. Within the Fraternity, Joe was President of his pledge class in the fall of 2004, and in 2006, he was named Pi Kappa Alpha's National Robertson Award winner signifying the top Pike undergraduate in the nation that year.

Joe's younger brother Dr. Jesse O'Shea '07 graduated as an internal medicine resident at Yale Hospital in Connecticut, and has now joined the medical staff at Emory University in Atlanta for an Infectious Disease fellowship. As an undergraduate at FSU, Jesse was a Truman Scholar and was named First Team USA Today Academic All-American, placing him among the Top 20 college scholars nationwide.

Joe and Jesse's older brother Robert O'Shea '02 was initiated into Pike at Alpha Eta Chapter, University of Florida. Robert passed into Chapter Eternal in 2014.

Pike Pledge Brothers Establish 'OneLife', a Unique Health & Wellness Clinic

Ken Winnard, M.D. and Ryan Goodkin, PharmD, met when they were re-Founders of Pi Kappa Alpha's Delta Lambda Chapter. "At a parade, Ken offered to let me check out his sweet Ford pickup truck, and a tall glass of 7 and 7... with ice," Goodkin remembers.

Since then, the two have remained close friends with like-minded interests. "We have remained friends through our love of free diving and all things health and wellness," Winnard says. In Tallahassee for a football game in 2017, Goodkin visited Winnard's health & wellness clinic "OneLife Health & Performance". Immediately, Goodkin knew he wanted to be a part of it. "Ken had this amazing idea to treat medicine as a preventative model, instead of the traditional sick-care model," Goodkin remembers, "He wanted to use tools like healthy lifestyle, clean eating, and fitness to help get people healthy and keep them healthy for life. That's what really sparked my interest."

The two partnered together, using Winnard's foundation and background as a Medical Doctor and Goodkin's background as a Pharmacist to grow OneLife. They moved the clinic to Palm Beach Gardens where they now see hundreds of patients from dozens of different states, both in-person and through telemedicine. "We are able to teach people the tools to optimize their health and prevent chronic disease," Winnard says. "Our partnership has helped our clinic grow to the next level. I'm so grateful that Delta Lambda helped bring this valuable partnership into my life, and I would encourage younger Brothers to really value those partnerships formed, because you never know where they may lead!"

Chapter News and Honors in 2020

Though this truncated school year ended abruptly in mid-March, Delta Lambda still achieved much deserved recognition and success, and the undergraduate Brothers are looking forward to dominating again in 2020-2021.

SMC Jacob Middleton '18 reported that The FSU Greek Life Office spotlighted Pike with their Pursuit of Excellence Awards at year's end. Pike won the Awards for 'Excellence in Rush' (fall rush chairman Austin Webb '16 and spring rush chairman Luke Vari '18), and for 'Commitment to Community Service'. Student Senator and Presidential Scholar Zach Blashinsky '16 was twice honored, winning the 'Student Seminole Award' as well as being named 'University Health Services (UHS) Student of the Year'.

Delta Lambda remains the largest fraternity chapter at FSU, as we have been for 20 years. Pike won the Overall Intramural Sports Championship for the twelfth time in 20 years. The new Student Body President is Jonathan Levin '18. He is the seventh Pike to serve in that office since 2003. And, more varsity athletes (football, baseball, basketball, golf, track) have chosen to join Pike than all the other fraternities combined.

Unfortunately, Pikes Illustrated will not be published this year, nor will a 2020 composite be taken. The school year was suspended just two weeks after our spring pledge class was initiated. Plans for the magazine and the composite had to be cancelled.



Pike Alumni Advisor/Undergraduate Leadership Luncheon, June 2020

Monthly Alumni/Undergraduate Leadership Luncheon past SMC Wyatt Rancourt '16 introduced FSU lineman Brady Scott '17 who addressed the Seminoles' preparations for 2020. Scott, a 6'6" 317 lb. offensive lineman started alternately at guard and tackle during 2019.

Brady addressed the status of Seminole football for 2020 and the team's preparation. This team has had three Head Coaches in four years, and there was some discussion surrounding the end of Coach Jimbo Fisher's tenure, and the atmosphere under Coach Willie Taggart. "Coach Norvell isn't playing around," Scott said. According to Scott, Norvell emphasizes avoiding penalties. "If just one of us screws up, then the whole unit has to [run laps]." Someone said it reminded him of the barracks scene in "Full Metal Jacket".

According to Scott, the team began workouts last week. "We start in the weight room at 7:30 AM, and we have to wear masks so it's no fun," he said. "At 2:30 PM we start running." He also said they're tested for the Covid19 virus "all the time".

Past SMC Wyatt Rancourt '16 reported that there are more or less 15 Pikes living in the house at any one time this summer. "The University has to make a decision about rush," he said. Some universities are considering 'virtual rush' for sororities, using Zoom functions. Virtual rush. Heaven help us.

Very sad news. Two Delta Lambda Brothers - Kirk Wesley Smith '86 and Toluwai "Tom" Idowu '17 - passed into Chapter eternal, unexpectedly and long before their time.





Greg Baker '84 writes, "Brothers, with a heavy heart I tell you our brother Kirk Wesley Smith '86 has joined the Chapter Eternal. He was one of the best guys I have ever known. He was my little brother and we had always managed to keep in touch over the years. He was my best friend in the last few years. We would talk two or three times a week.

"He was Airforce ROTC in college, flew in the Gulf Wars and became Pilot in Command for Southwest Airlines for 20 plus years. He once told me that he had only one job interview in his life, they hired him on the spot.

"To anyone who had met him, he was always the most positive and supportive man I have ever been lucky to have known. His friends and pledge brothers can attest to that.

"Kirk is survived by his three children, Brennan, Ava and Gary (who is named for Kirks' Father). He raised them right, his oldest son attended Harvard, was a Phoenix there and worked overseas after graduation. He gave all that up and decided to become a Green Beret. He graduated in April. If there are any Pike Brothers who might know some people, I'm sure he could use a Rabbi. Kirks' plan for him was to

become the Governor of Arizona and Mike Holloman '86 and I will still make that happen when the time comes as Kirk wanted.

"His daughter Ava is 11 and his youngest son is 4 and when I visited in January, I saw they were the love of his life, he was devoted to them. They are magnificent young people, full of promise.

"We have all lost friends early in life and parents in the natural way but this one seems to hurt the most, too young with so much left behind.

"Love the people in your lives, we never know when they may be taken from us."

"Tom" Idowu '17 passed away yesterday afternoon in his apartment in Tallahassee. SMC Jacob Middleton '18 and Former President Wyatt Rancourt '16 both stated that Tom had a heart condition. Tom is Nigerian; I'm unsure if he has family in Tallahassee. I am told he was a stellar Brother and is the Little Brother to Zach Blashinsky '16.

Tom was jogging with friends in mid-afternoon near his off-campus apartment where he passed out. His friends started CPR and called 911. He was dead on arrival to the hospital. Tom was going to be a senior in the fall, a Christian and a member of Downtown City Church, DCC. Dylan Nielander '15, Pike Alumnus and a college Pastor at DCC, held a virtual meeting with about 48 brothers last week to provide counseling and grief services. Tom was an outstanding brother and will be missed.

The undergrads started a Go Fund Me page about two days ago and created t-shirts. They have already raised \$5,000 for the funeral arrangements. This is deep reflection of our bond in brotherhood.


Our Brother Tom Idowu '17 passed away suddenly on April 29th, 2020 from cardiac arrest while jogging. Tom was a walk-on on the Florida State Track Team, but was unable to fulfill his dream because of a heart condition. Pi Kappa Alpha at Florida State would like to raise money for funeral expenses as well as other expenses the family may incur. Tom had a profound effect on our fraternity and left a legacy of kindness, love, and faith within all of us. We are heartbroken at Tom's passing. Any donation will go towards supporting the Idowu family through this difficult time."

This passage is from Tom's obituary in Rockledge, Florida.

"Toluwani "Tom" Idowu was a Dean's list senior at Florida State University where he was earning a double major in creative writing and psychology. Due to his sudden passing, he has been awarded a Florida State University memorial degree. Tom was employed by the university as a student consultant, liaising between faculty and students to assist in learning strategies to ensure academic success in subject areas. He was also a member of FSU's Pi Kappa Alpha. Tom's foundational years included the achievement of regional finalist in the Scripps National Spelling Bee Championship, a black belt Taekwondo, and Congressional awards for his contribution to the arts and student government in high school.

Born on Christmas Day in 1997, Tom had an active faith and belief in Jesus Christ. Tom participated in Campus Crusade for Christ at FSU and was a well-known member of Downtown Community Church and Westwood Church in Tallahassee, Florida. Tom had many interests and passions—composing music, nature photography, art, working out, and just having a good time eating and hanging out with friends, or enjoying online Xbox games. He lived life to the fullest. His creativity, kind heart, and friendliness will be missed by all those whose lives he touched."
