





Delta Lambda Re-Founding Charter Member **Clint Wallace '01** was featured, along with his family, on the cover of a local Tallahassee magazine in November. "Many of you know his face from the billboards of the Scott & Wallace law firm, or from the

many amazing things their family does for our community," the article began. Clint and Elizabeth met at FSU, and a sorority date function. The article continues, praising Clint and Elizabeth for their extensive community involvement.

Every Pike from the 1970s remembers 'Night Owl'. **Alan Winslette '77** was a renown disc-jockey at parties in Tallahassee, and was an imposing figure on the Greek landscape. Today, Alan owns Laser Shot, Inc., the global leader in firearms simulation training for military and police.

When the new Pike house opened in 2005, Alan outfitted the 'Firemen's Lounge' with all sorts of video games and simulators.

In 2021-22, in addition to all the new electronic toys, Alan is investing between \$30,000-40,000 as his additional gift to Delta Lambda. Alan is paying for all the renovations, materials and labor costs.

jumped through all the hoops and all went well.



Luke Vari's Message as Outgoing SMC

"Delta Lambda has endured many struggles and challenges the past year, but we emerged stronger than before. Severe social restrictions brought on by Covid, plus formal rush that was conducted campus-wide by Zoom interviews and other limitations to in-person contact, all failed to dampen the spirit of PiKA.

"I am proud to tell you that Delta Lambda initiated more than 60 men from our fall pledge class, finances are solid, and we are good standing with the University. Not all fraternities fared as well.

I also wanted to reach out and provide you with some updates about our historic home, which is now 'Sembler House'.

"Alan Winslette '77 has re-done the Fireman's lounge. Thanks to his ideas along with Pete Ford '18 and his guys, there seems to be a new life in that room. Last night after the (FSU) game Alan purchased two 75-inch flatscreens, one for the Fireman's and another one for the bar in Sembler Hall. Alan also put in a new screen board, projector, and three sounders for those areas. The only thing we have to do now is to

hang the TVs. I'm going to encourage the Chapter to focus on the Fireman's Lounge for this year's major project. Ideally, Firemen's would be a perfect lounge and game room.

"Alan and **Jimmy Keen '73** and I had an extensive conversation regarding his plans to remodel the Fireman's room. He has plans to put enough bar stools for seating around the bar. Pete has already installed the bar with additional upgrades.

"Alan is paying for all the renovations, materials and labor costs. He already erected a laser shot shooting gallery; one 7' TV with projector and screen, and a second laser-shot. Total cost of his contribution to Delta Lambda is between \$30,000 and \$40,000.

"Another goal is to get a custom pool table for the Fireman's lounge, with our beloved Pike crest in the middle. I've heard all of the skepticism about how it would be ruined and what could go wrong, but here is one possible solution. I would like to make the top of the pool table the outdoor billiard cloth material, I would also buy a thick cover with grommets, running a cable through to wrap around the table legs, unlocking when either myself or the house managers convenience, giving us the ability to monitor who is responsible for the table at that time.

"I want to close my remarks with extreme praise for our Rush Chairman **James Bencivenga '20.**

"In-person rush for Pike was a massive success. As we opened on the second day, it became apparent how chaotic and unprepared many other fraternities were, given how most of Greek Life had not seen a formal in-person Rush at all until last week. Unsurprisingly, Pike was prepared. Brothers were at the house two and a half hours before we opened our doors, with older Brothers mentoring younger Brothers. "We all walked through rush in the perspective of a rushee, to ensure that every Brother was informed of our process in whole, regardless of their specific role. It really did come together beautifully. **Joaquin Lopez '21** rose to the occasion and exceeded expectations. He made sure to reach out and invited every name on our Legacy list to come to the house, and made sure our 'filters' knew who they were, and to fast-track them.

"As SMC I benefitted from the leadership and support of exceptional individuals on our executive committee. These officers oversaw the entire Pike operation, as well as mentoring younger Brothers who will take leadership positions soon. "Our alumni support has been terrific, especially John Peacock, Eli Nortelus, Dylan Nielander, Doug Russell, Brent Sembler, Jimmy Keen and Peter Ford, as well as Scottie Howell even though he lives in New Mexico now, and our favorite Delta Tau Delta, our attorney Tor Friedman. The monthly leadership luncheons have been well attended by loyal alumni.

Jack McMullen '64: "Our beloved brother, **Ray Hayes**, entered chapter eternal @ 5:40 AM today...Ray was our SMC in 1965-66...a wonderful brother/friend to us ALL....Ray had been in declining health for a while [Parkinson's disease and other maladies].

"Jim Cobb's email (below) recalling Ray's involvement in the new Pike house [in mid-60s] is on point. Actually, Ray was VERY instrumental in the conceiving/nurturing & development of the new house we moved into in 1967. Ray worked tirelessly with Pike National to make it a reality. I vividly remember: the house cost \$330,000 unfurnished.

"Carolyn and I had a nice long chat with Patti Hayes last evening....Ray had lived the good life...and the time had come for Ray entering Chapter Eternal...We Brother PIKES

will be there someday, so let's enjoy LIFE to the fullest meanwhile. "Carolyn and I look forward to seeing the many brothers and spouses [of the mid-60s] at our reunion at the Miami/FSU game weekend November 12. I'm sure our many memories of Ray will be a major topic of conversation & bonding."

Jim Cobb '63: "A great tribute to a great Pike. Thanks for sharing your special relationship with Ray. I had the pleasure of serving as THC while Ray was SMC and we had a challenging year preparing to build the new Pike House. We had a wonderful working relationship and as a result our new house became a reality. Ray will be missed by all but we may meet again in the chapter eternal."

David Lyons '65: "Sad day as Ray Hayes was my Big Brother in the Fraternity. We kept in touch, went on two cruises together, and he was our overnight guest in Tally, and we were also house guests in Coral Gables. Say a prayer for his wife Patty as life will never be the same. Enjoy time each and every day!"

Frank Cooke '65: "Ray was certainly a wonderful gentleman; he will definitely be missed. We met at Miami Dade Junior College in 1961, in Tri Chi where we were brothers and continued our friendship all these years. Don Altemus '66: "I spoke with Patti this morning. She called to give me the bad news. He passed at 5:25 am today. I will be assisting her with anything she needs. She is a strong lady and was dealing with the funeral home arriving at the house when we spoke. I will share as I learn more detail as she hopes to plan for a service."

Dave Frew '67: "My heart is broken. Ray was a quality man. He inspired me during my days at the Pike House."

Gabe Brady '58 (past SMC) "I did not know Ray, but God bless him and his family."

Van Williams `64: "Like everyone I am saddened to hear of Ray's passing. We are all getting up there and each will be following when it is our time. I'm just grateful for the friendships and all the great times we had together-it could not have been better."

Bill Knight '69: "I knew Ray for a relatively short time, and found him most genuine and always willing to help those in need. Admirable attributes that, no doubt, followed him always.

Tom Wurzbach '64: "It saddened me to hear that, "The Boss" Brother Hayes had gone to Chapter Eternal. I know he is at peace and the chapter has welcomed him. We can rejoice, by the grace of God Almighty, in the fact that, one day, we will all be together again. Phi Phi Kappa Alpha."

Dave Orr '63: "Delta Lambda Brothers, like so many of us during our Pike days, Ray became a part of our lives during this special time in all of our lives. Of the many friendships we all developed during this time, I considered Ray to be one of my BEST four(4) friends! There was initially a Miami group from several different Miami High schools that pledged Pike - myself, Ray, Don Altemus (Altitude), Sandy King, Barry Drossner, Lewis DeLaura, even John Walker, John Friese (Froggy) and Arne Johansen from Broward. And Ray had our Miami High/Miami Edison rivalry always present. When Ray graduated after the Fall/65, Bob Duggan stepped up as SMC and somehow, I was elected as IMC. He left a fabulous legacy in so many areas, not the least was our Friday afternoons at Teds - anybody remember that? So, to Ray and too many of those departed, i.e., Russ Burnett, Sandy King, Craig Kafka, Hubert Green, Bob Stoner, Bob Humphries, Doug Cooke, John Friese to name a few, we lift that mug high once again to say "Thanks for the Memories"!
