## **Latest Update on Delta Lambda and FSU**

The world is suffering under the scourge of this terrible affliction. When America emerges from the other side, there will no doubt be some cultural and economic changes. Some say that many small colleges will disappear. Others speculate that

fewer full-time students will return to the big public campuses. No one really knows. Our monthly Delta Lambda Newsletter deals with FSU fraternities and Pi Kappa Alpha exclusively. The IFC system here has endured some tough times these last couple of years. A purge of FSU fraternity charters began several years ago. Some of you remember when Florida State counted 27 fraternities in the IFC. At the end of this school year, only 12 are left, and two of those are under suspension or investigation.

Your Delta Lambda has enjoyed incredible prosperity since re-chartering in 2000, and that success continues today. At the end of this truncated school year, Pike was awarded its 12th Overall Intramural Championship in 20 years. That's more than all the other fraternities combined since our return. A Pike was elected Student Body President this March, our 7th in the past 17 years. They now say that if you are a student at FSU for four years, you will know at least one Pike Student Body President. Within a year after re-Founding in 2000, Pike became the largest fraternity at FSU and has never since relinquished that position.

You might to shocked to know which of our ancient rivals no longer have chapters here. Phi Delt, Sigma Chi, Lambda Chi, Delta Tau Delta, Pi Kappa Phi, Phi Kappa Tau are all gone, at least currently. ATO is listed by the University as being on 'restricted status' (but as of now they're still a chartered fraternity).

Since 2000, Delta Lambda has had our own share of set-backs and close calls, but more than any other reason, the thing that has kept the chapter moving on the right track (even when the wheels threatened to come off) is sustained involvement by loyal, mature and responsible alumni. At least 20 men serve officially on the Chapter Advisory Board, and more are involved in peripheral capacities. Many of these also have sons who have come through the chapter.

The absence of hands-on, involved alumni in numbers seems to correlate to chapters getting into the kind of trouble that cost them their charter. Our Delta Lambda alumni do not run the chapter, but there is a shared trust with the undergraduate leaders. Our obvious and continued interest in their well-being impresses the undergrads and helps them to understand that Delta Lambda/Pi Kappa Alpha is an association for a lifetime.

Delta Lambda has long been a Fraternity of 'Alpha Males'. We are just as capable of bringing down the house now as we were at any time in the past. Humility and vigilance are in order.

Our undergraduates are wonderful; you would be and should be very proud of them.

Luke Vari '18 is the latest in a long line of extraordinary Rush Chairmen. He wrote, "Gentlemen, I wanted to reach out and ask how you are doing...It is unfortunate that we couldn't continue to the remainder of the spring, but with bigger issues at hand, I think it was definitely for the best.

That being said, this fall we are going to come out swinging. We are all excited to get back (hopefully) and continue our spring domination into the fall. I'm sure you have already heard that we are the Overall IM Champs for the 4th year in a row, with second place being not even close. It was tough to leave school just before softball, 4x4 football and dodgeball as we were expecting championships in all of those."

It's important that our alumni and everyone else know what we were doing before

these unfortunate circumstances, but more importantly, what we plan on doing after. I know it's going to take some time before returning to normal again, but we are going to control what we can and nonetheless make the best of it. Just know that (SMC Jake) Middleton '18 and the rest of Exec are already beginning to plan for fall, as its definitely going to be one for the books. As always, I hope that you and your families are doing well and staying safe. Hope you all have a Happy Easter and God Bless!


