Senior Rush Captains Dinner at the Governor's Club, January 7, 2020

Because of Pike's aggressive recruiting, as many as 14 of the 22-man class were pre-signed in advance of rush week.

Typically, a spring pledge class includes rising campus leaders, high academic achievers and varsity athletes who have sought membership in Pi Kappa Alpha, and this one is no exception. The 22-man class includes four Seminole football players, two baseball players plus men on the Club Rugby and Lacrosse teams. One pledge, actor and writer Gonzalo Londoño, has already garnered four National Student Production EMMY Awards. Another pledge has set his goal of becoming Student Body President. The four football players are OL Rob Elder, OL Jay Williams, QB Wyatt Rector and K Parker Grothaus. The baseball players are catcher Matthew Nelson and infielder Tyler Martin who is grandson of Coach Mike Martin '06.

Rush Chairman Luke Vari '18 says, "Delta Lambda Pike is a fraternity of high achievers. The chapter and my senior rush captains worked hard to recruit only men who are willing and able to contribute to this legacy."

SMC Jacob Middleton '18 and Luke each mentioned chapter initiatives to ensure continued involvement by our varsity athletes. "Some of them are very active; around all the time." They mentioned linebacker Tyler Gilroy '18 who currently serves on the Executive Committee as Title IX Officer. "We see Gilroy as the next Phil Doumar," they laughed. Phil Doumar '09 is the legend of an earlier generation. Doumar was Pike Rush Chairman, Delta Gamma Anchor Man, started at long snapper for three years and was largely responsible for the presence of 9 Delta Lambda Pikes on the Seminoles' 2013 National Championship team.

Delta Lambda Brother Jonathan Levin '18 is expected to run for FSU Student Body President this spring. If he wins, he will be the 7th Pike to hold this office since 2003.



On one of Bobby Bowden's patented trick plays, Lowrey handed to Cedric Jones, who passed back to Lowrey moving wide for the score.

Kelly is a loyal Delta Lambda alum, and was a phenomenal softball player for the chapter.

"The TIME Dealer of the Year award is one of the automobile industry's most prestigious and highly coveted honors. Recipients are among the nation's most successful auto dealers who also demonstrate a long-standing commitment to community service.

"I purchased a majority of the [family] dealership in 1994," he explained. "I then merged my dealership into Sonic Automotive to go public in 1998 and bought my current dealership in Tallahassee in 2000."

"Marks contributes to numerous charitable organizations in both the Tampa Bay area and the Tallahassee region. The groups that are closest to his heart include the Florida Sheriffs "Youth Ranches, Florida United Methodist Children's Home (Enterprise, Florida) and YMCA of the Suncoast. "Helping young people, who by no fault of their own, are in difficult family situations, is a passion of mine," he said. "My drive is to support them and help provide the foundation from which they can propel themselves forward in their own lives."

"A financial benefactor of his alma mater, Florida State University, and his fraternity, Pi Kappa Alpha, Marks also supports Harborside Christian Church in Safety Harbor, Florida, and Samaritan's Purse, an international relief organization, as well as groups that assist first responders. He and his wife, Terri, have six children."
