


Having already been initiated as part of the spring pledge class, these new Brothers have chosen to participate in something like an advanced seminar in Delta Lambda history and traditions.

National and University mandates have made the pledge process unreasonably short for a very large chapter like ours. Consequently, Delta Lambda leaders developed a

sort of graduate program for young Brothers who want to establish their credentials early as future pacesetters and executives. Subjects cover risk management and legal parameters, chapter management, the Ed Cubbon Speech, and include personal contacts with influential alumni. Participation is voluntary.

Barry was a first round NFL Draft pick in 1973, and his son **Andrew Smith '10** is also a Delta Lambda. Chris finished his undergraduate and Law School studies with a perfect 4.0 GPA. He was awarded the Game Ball for his outstanding play at defensive back during Homecoming, 1972, and was named FSU's Top Male Scholar-Athlete in 1973.

RIGHT: **Ben McKay '88** at the annual Daddy-Daughter Dance. Ben currently serves on the National FSU Alumni Association Executive Committee. He is the CEO & Executive Director of the Surplus Line Association of California (SLA), the largest association of its type in the country. Ben was in Washington for 8 years as Senior VP for Federal Governmental Relations, and in that role, he was named one of Washington, D.C.'s top lobbyists five times by The Hill, one of the city's most influential political newspapers.

Ben McKay was a member of one of the best pledge classes in Delta Lambda history: Spring, 1988. Unfortunately, their tenure was very brief before the roof caved in and we lost the chapter.

To Pi Kappa Alpha's credit, many of those men still remain loyal and supportive of the chapter, while achieving great success in their own careers.

When Ben was a Law student at FSU, he developed a close friendship with future FSU President Sandy D'Alemberte. After D'Alemberte invited the Pikes to return to FSU in 1999, Ben served as the close liaison between Sandy and the Pike alumni.
